### SCNA and AANR-West Will Co-Sponsor Nudist Play for L.A. Fringe Festival

The SCNA and AANR-West are co-sponsoring a new nudist-themed production being staged for this year's Hollywood Fringe Festival. As with the productions staged in past years, this play is being directed by Brian Knudson, a longtime member of the SCNA club.

In 1931, Tom Cushing wrote a light comedy play called "Barely Proper" which told the story of a young couple coming home to meet the parents of the female character before her and her fiancé are to be married. The twist is that the male half of the couple doesn't know that her and her family are nudists. The original play took place in Europe with the lead male a very proper and stuffy English gentleman while the female's family is of German descent.

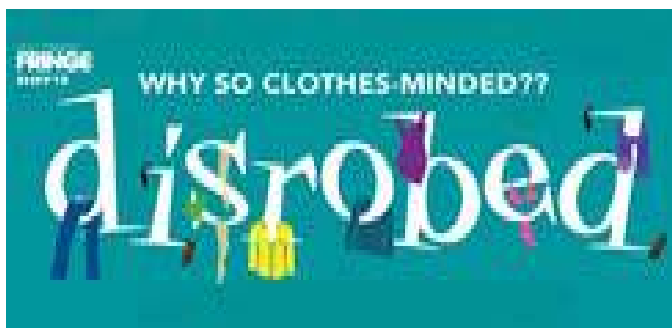
Brian enlisted the help of a local award-winning playwright, Steven Vlasak, to update and Americanize the play, and to reduce the cast from the original fifteen characters down to six. This new version has been retitled, "Disrobed – Why So Clothes-Minded?"

The production, like all the previous ones that Brian has staged, will have a mandatory nude audience requirement for an immersive experience!

There will be four performances only: Thursday, June 13 at 9:30 pm, Sunday, June 16 for a 2:30 pm matinee, Sunday, June 23 for a 2:30 pm matinee, and Friday, June 28 for a midnight performance and nude after party

All performances will take place at the Studio/Stage located at 520 N. Western Ave, LA 90004.

**When: Sunday, May 19, 8:00 am**

The annual Bay to Breakers 12k race runs west through the city starting at the Embarcadero and finishing 7.3 miles later at Ocean Beach on the Pacific Coast. The "Bare to Breakers" is the nudist contingent in this yearly foot race. Participants run up the iconic Hayes Street Hill, along the Panhandle and through Golden Gate Park, while the city of San Francisco cheers them on. About 80,000 people regularly attend with several hundred enjoying the run while nude or top free.

## Olive Dell Hosts Record Number of Runners at Annual Bare Burro 5K Run

Sunday, April 28 was the largest turnout yet for the Annual Bare Burro 5K Run at Olive Dell Ranch. There were 360 pre-registered runners this year. And few more signed up the day of the race.

At registration all the runners were given chipped tags to wear on their shoes which automatically recorded their time as they crossed the finish line and displayed it to them on a large timer.

For the second year in a row, the first-place overall winner was Zach E. who came in at 20 minutes 42 seconds, and the fastest female was Anselmo H. who came in at 24.26. (Most runners came at about an hour.) The top three finishers in each age category received prizes from the sponsors, Pickle Juice and Goodr Sunglasses.

This is Olive Dell's premier event of the year, and many of the runners remained afterwards to enjoy their first nudist experience relax in the pool and jacuzzi and make new friends with the great people who make this event so enjoyable!

## Nudists Enjoy Beer Mile Run

If you like beer, you should have been up at Olive Dell on Saturday, the day before the Burro Run.

The beer mile is a fun tradition with many running groups. You start by drinking a beer, running a ¼ mile, drink another beer, run ¼ mile etc. until you complete one mile.

Since it's at Olive Dell, participants must do it naked! You can run, walk, skip, saunter, stroll or crawl your way to the finish line. About 100 people started the race.

They also had sodas for the kids and non-beer drinkers who participated. Those who completed the race (more than a few could not finish) were awarded little plastic shovels to wear around their neck.

## Beer Pong Goes Supersized!

A few years ago, Olive Dell added their Naked Beer Mile the day before the Bare Burro event. This year, they added a second preliminary event: a game of Giant Beer Pong!

Normally the game is played where red Solo cups filled with beer are set up in a pyramid on either side of a table. You play in teams. The object is to bounce or shoot a ping pong ball into one of the cups on the opposite side of the table. If you make it into one of the cups, your opponent must chug a beer and the cup is removed from the game. The winning team is the one who can get their opponents to remove their cups from the table.

Becki Kilborn, co-owner of Olive Dell, had the brilliant idea to supersize the game. She purchased twelve 55-gallon red plastic containers. She painted the top of the containers white, to resemble a large Solo cup. Becki also purchased several white volley balls, which substituted for the "ping pong" balls. In fact, the playing area turned out to be so large, it had to be played on the park's Pickleball court!

There were a lot of people who participated, and as it progressed, and the beer got guzzled, it became apparent that no one cared about the rules or even who was on which team! It was all good-natured nudist fun that proved to be a lot harder as time wore on and people's aims got worse.

The Supersized Beer Pong was such a hit, the park will feature it again at their upcoming Memorial Day Rocking the Ranch Music Festival.

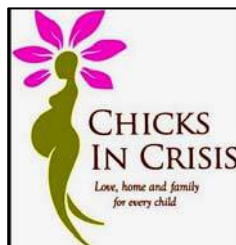

## Laguna del Sol Raises \$\$\$ for Local Women's Group Charity

Laguna del Sol (LDS) hosted a casino night on May 4 to raise money for the nearby Chicks in Crisis charity.

Based in Elk Grove, a few miles north of LDS, the non-profit organization reaches out to teens, young women, and foster youth who are pregnant or at-risk to help them stay off the streets and become responsible parents within the community.



"Each year LDS choses a local charity to support; this is the first time Chicks in Crisis was selected," said a park spokesperson. "Our members seemed happy with the choice." The 2-hr. event took place in the park clubhouse. "People made their donation to enter the gaming area where fake LDS script was used at the various tables. At the end of the night, people could use their winnings to bid on some nice raffle items."

Many women stopped and asked where we were located and were happy to hear that we represent a region of states and were excited to hear about AANR being an international organization.

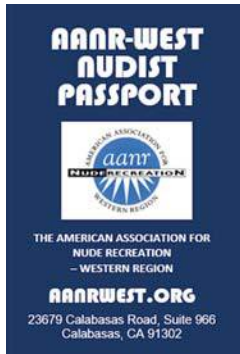

### Have You Used Your Passport Yet?



Clubs may have already begun greeting at their check-in desks some of the 230 people in the region who have received their Passport books. Be sure your club staff know what to do when someone presents them their book (answer: find your club page inside – alphabetical by state and then club name – and stamp the book in both the front and back sections of the book.

Don't have a Passport book yet? You may purchase one at any participating club in the 8 western states, or you may purchase one at the AANR-West website at [www.aanrwest.org](http://www.aanrwest.org), may via PayPal for \$10 online including shipping. Books cost less at most clubs (usually around \$5).

The Passport program is a way for AANR members and their guests to visit many different clubs. We especially wanted to encourage our Associate members, who are not affiliated with any club, to feel more welcome at the nudist parks and also at the many non-landed local clubs and bed and breakfast sites affiliated with AANR that are scattered throughout the eight western states.”

### Convention Delegate Credentials Packets Being Sent to All Clubs

AANR-West will be sending out a packet in the mail to all club presidents by the end of May concerning your participation in the summer convention, July 25-28.

The convention this year will be held at **Mountain Air Ranch** in the hills above Denver. Rooms are sold out on the grounds but camping sites are still available, as are rooms at a motel a few minutes away. Many fun events and interesting workshops are being planned so we hope all our clubs can send delegates to attend.

All clubs and Associate (members not affiliated with a club) are eligible to participate and vote at this annual meeting where your ideas and suggestions for improving our service and operations get discussed and voted on. Clubs get delegates based on a formula of one vote per 25 AANR members.

All clubs need to mail back a signed form listing the names of who their delegates and alternates to the convention will be. Also included in the packet will be nomination forms should anyone wish to run for a seat on the Board of Directors for AANR-West. There are five Director seats open this year, and all four officers will also be up for election (President, VP, Secretary, and Treasurer). Please consider giving some volunteer time this next year!

Also in the packet will be forms to nominate any worthy **Man of the Year, Woman of the Year, and Family of the Year**. We prefer these awards be given to the unsung heroes in the clubs who work very hard and deserve some recognition.

## Nudists Rally to Support Florida's Blind Creek Beach

In response to an urgent request by the Treasure Coast Naturists (TCN) group in Fort Pierce, Florida, individual naturists as well as national and regional organizations have taken immediate action to counter a state agency's threat to close the clothing-optional Blind Creek Beach on nearby Hutchinson Island.

The South Florida Free Beaches, Florida Naturist Association, the Naturist Society Foundation, the Naturist Action Committee (NAC), the B.E.A.C.H.E.S. Foundation, and other naturist organizations started fundraising together during the past month to hire a lobbyist and secure legal representation against recent actions and threats by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP).

### Background

About 15 years ago, St. Lucie County established Blind Creek Beach County Park as an isolated Hutchinson Island preserve located immediately north of the St. Lucie Nuclear Power Plant. Before the county park's official startup, this same section of isolated shoreline was host to a long tradition of nude sunbathing and swimming. Begun as far back as the 1970s, the free beach attracted naturists from around North America. Skinny dippers encountered a pristine piece of coastline that was relatively free of arrests or harassment.

In 2014, negotiations between local naturist advocates, the St. Lucie County Sheriff's Office, and the St. Lucie County Attorney led to the recognition that this isolated stretch of beach and its tradition of family-oriented skinny-dipping did not run afoul of the state's anti-nudity statute (SS-800.03) as long as lewd behavior did not occur. County deputies quietly patrolled the beach just like any other and the local government tolerated and even cooperated with the non-profit TCN group who managed the beach by patrolling the shore protecting the sensitive dunes from human intrusion, providing portable bathrooms to beach-goers, managing the parking lot, and organizing beach clean-ups and occasional town hall meetings. A range of 500-1000 naturists show up on weekends, and the county saw a marked increase in tourist revenue in the area.

### The Current Situation

Three years later, the Florida DEP sent a complaint to St. Lucie County objecting to the county's tolerance of a nude beach on what it sees as State-owned land (much of Hutchinson Island land is leased by the county from the state park system.) More threatening letters followed with the demand that the naturist

use be shut down or moved away from Blind Creek Beach. The response from St. Lucie County has been largely silent. With the backing of business leaders and others, the county chose to let the beach continue and thrive.

In March 2019 TCN discovered that DEP was getting ready to take immediate additional actions to compel St. Lucie County to close down all nude use of Blind Creek Beach, since the naturists refuse to back down or leave this beach. Instead, they began a fundraising effort and hired Ramon Maury, the longtime state lobbyist and legal advisor to Haulover Beach, the South Florida Free Beaches, the Florida Naturist Association, and the American Association for Nude Recreation Florida Region.

According to Maury, there are two steps that must be undertaken:

**Step I** encompasses placing a hold on DEP's actions to quickly shut down Blind Creek Beach. Maury has opened up a dialog with each of the stakeholders in Tallahassee and is working to impose a temporary hold on all pending actions that might stop naturism at Blind Creek Beach.

**Step II** involves opening a conversation with key members in the Florida state legislature to rewrite state park rules and/or regulations that currently discourage the establishment of sanctioned nude beaches in Florida.

Undertaking both steps is expensive, so TCN is asking all naturists in the country to help by making a financial contribution.
