Nude Recreation Booth at L.A. Travel Show Draws a Large and Enthusiastic Crowd

AANR-West once again sponsored a booth at the show to talk to those attendees interested in exploring the places and opportunities for nude recreation around the western USA. This year the Travel Show drew close to 50,000 visitors over the weekend of February 15 & 16.

The Travel Show was held at the LA Convention Center. There were just over 500 booths and workshops featuring different travel destinations from around our nation and the world, plus various travel products.

Our booth was strategically located on the intersection of two main aisles, so we got maximum foot traffic exposure. We gave out several hundred brochures and handouts from virtually all the clubs and resorts in the west. One of the main attractions to the booth was our banner and flyers for the **World Naked Bike Ride**. Many people who don't consider themselves nudists were excited and interested in the ride. (The ride through downtown Los Angeles is scheduled for Saturday June 27.)



We also had a prize wheel to giveaway promotional items from AANR-West. The most popular prize wheel giveaways were the water bottles and the gel writing pens. Kids of all ages loved winning beach balls.

We also gave away "Nudist and I Vote" buttons, but only to people who promised to wear them the rest of the day around the exhibit hall. Wearing the pins prompted interest around the exhibit hall and drove business to our booth as others wanted their own pin.

Over 150 people signed up for the raffle prizes provided by the Clothing-Optional Home Network. They gave away 2-night stays at two of their B&B's, Arroyo Del Sol in Altadena. We also had a weekend stay and two beach towels donated by Glen Eden for the raffle.

End of Year AANR Membership Numbers Announced

The AANR main office in Kissimmee, FL has released the final membership numbers as of December 31, 2019. AANR gained a net of 161 members for the year, bringing the new total to 30,250. This breaks down to 59% are members from 175 clubs across the US and Canada, and 41% are Associate members who are not affiliated with any club.

AANR West lost a net of 11 members, most of that coming from Glen Eden, which has not yet fully recovered from the fires and floods of year ago. Of the clubs with over 15 members, the largest gain in the West was at Wasatch Naturists in Utah which almost doubled its size to 35.

Statistically, AANR-West has 24% of all AANR members nationally. The breakdown by AANR-West state:

Scholarship Period Ends April 30 for College-bound Applicants



As we announced last month, the AANR-West Scholarship Program has been expanded to cover not only those who want to

attend a college, but also a vocational or technical training school; open to all ages, anyone seeking continued education.

College-bound applicants still need to submit their application to AANR-West by the **April 30** deadline, however vocation school reimbursement can apply any time. There will still be up to **two college scholarships** of \$2,000 each awarded every June (we formally announce the winners at the annual summer convention in July).

Second, since **vocational schools**, run courses year-round applications can be submitted at any time. This money is on a first come first serve basis.

AANR-West Kids' Camp Program Coming Together: No Child Should Be Turned Away

As we reported last month, the AANR-West Kids Camp will be held June 21-25 at De Anza Springs. It is open to children between ages 8 and 16, with activities designed for different age brackets, depending who signs up.

We have confirmed the camp will have several experienced youth counsellors to guide these activities. Parents are encouraged to help supervise also, especially if their participating children are under age 12.

These include pool games, various arts and crafts, sports competitions, cooking, and a talent show. There will also be a beach trip.

The camp is intended for the children and grandchildren of AANR members, but guest children will not be turned away.

Although the final prices have not been determined yet, organizers say it will probably be in the \$200 range per child. We are **asking the clubs to pitch in** and help subsidize the fee for children from their own members, if possible. If a child cannot afford the fee, other financial arrangements or work tradeoffs can be made. Again, we don't want any kid who wants to come to be turned away

The full activity itinerary and pricing information will be discussed at the upcoming Board of Directors meeting March 14 at De Anza Springs.

AANR Trustees Meet in Florida

Our Western Region's Trustee was unable to attend the recent Mid-Winter AANR meeting in Florida. Since I had to be there anyway for the Regional President's meeting, I was called to step up and represent the region at the Big Table. The meeting, held February 7-8, covered the usual committee reports from Strategic Planning, Marketing, Public Relations, and Government Affairs. Some of the highlights:

AANR Budget

The Trustees passed its annual budget which includes \$ 44,000 up front expense for the new Impexium database system, and a \$22,000 expense to cover the May biannual elections. They are only project a \$ 3500 savings per month from converting to an electronic Bulletin magazine because most members have indicated they want to continue with a printed copy.

Impexium

The Executive Director Erich Schuttauf presented a one-hour review of the new data entry software and he showed some of the capabilities of the new system. He said he thinks most of the screens will be intuitive and not require much instruction. I offered to help with a training book, since that is my professional background.

Unfortunately, the system will NOT have automatic renewals, as was hoped last summer. Erich said the complexities of dues collection at the club level make this impossible. I am not sure why they can't do this for just the Associates since they are direct pay, but the office says they will figure it out after the system goes fully operational by the end of March. The dues renewal part of the system is operational currently but not the Query function and other management features which the regions are anxious to use.

Government Affairs (GAT)

There was a long discussion about some legislation introduced around the country. The most important thing

discussed under GAT was the introduction of a bill in the **Florida** legislature to legalize "clothing-optional" beaches in the state. All the beaches there have been negotiated by local nudist groups on a one-by-one arrangement with local cities and counties. Two years ago, an economic study revealed that nudist tourists bring in over a billion dollars in revenue to the state. That got their attention so now legislators are interested! A lobbyist was hired by AANR Florida, South Florida Beaches, and the BEACHES Foundation to help the bill through the required committees. The lobbyist, Ramon Maury, spoke to the Trustees on Saturday morning and described what he was doing and the possibility of getting the bill approved. That was worth the whole trip as it gave me ideas for the Western Region.

President's Council

The presidents from the seven AANR regions met for about an hour, privately, to discuss issues of concern and to share some of their marketing ideas. One of the best ideas, from the Texas region, is an event patch to iron onto a beach towel. We are considering it for the clubs in the Western Region.

Hall of Fame

Having nothing else to do, I also sit on the AANR Hall of Fame Committee, seeking individuals worthy of the honor for their lifetime achievements. The 2020 selection process has begun. Please submit to me any names you think worthy of the honor before the May 1 deadline.

AANR-West Board to Meet at De Anza Springs

Each March, the AANR-West Board of Directors meet to discuss policy issues and to check the progress on our planned activities for the year. The meeting will be held Saturday March 14 at De Anza Spring Resort in Jacumba, CA, about an hour's drive east of San Diego.

All AANR-West members are invited to participate in the discussions and to contribute their own ideas.

A packet of information was sent to all club presidents via email the last week in February. Please read it in advance and bring a printed copy with you to the meeting.

On the planned agenda is:

- A workshop to plan the details and pricing for the Kids' Camp scheduled June 21-25 at De Anza.
- A review of our current regional web site with recommendations for improvements.
- A review of our trade show schedule for the remainder of the year and of the giveaway items and literature distributed at them.
- A review of the 2019 final budget numbers and progress report on the 2020 Profit and Loss projections.
- Decisions about the Passport program for 2020-21.
- Decisions about the locations of future Board meetings and conventions.

- \$40/person until March 15

- \$55 registration on day of the run.

If you want to camp all weekend and also compete in the Naked Beer Mile Race the day before the 5K, the complete package including grounds fees are:

- \$100.00 per person until March 15
- \$115.00 per person March 16 – 23

Running shoes are strongly recommended for runners on the gravel and dirt course, but nudity is not an "option," it's a requirement for the race.

Shangri La Ranch Hosts a “Celebrating Logan” Blood Drive

At age 17, Logan Malone started having trouble breathing. After an ER visit Logan was transported to Phoenix Children’s Hospital where he received a devastating diagnosis: Soft Cell Undifferentiated – Spindle Cell Sarcoma. Cancer had spread to his lungs and bones.

Over the next eight weeks, Logan bravely endured two rounds of chemotherapy and several blood transfusions. Logan said his final goodbye to his parents, family and friends on October 28, 2019.

Logan’s parents, Al and Christi Lambie, are fulltime residents of Shangri La Ranch.

To honor Logan, thirty members & guests of Shangri-La, as well as members of the New River community, registered to donate their blood on Sunday February 23, in his memory. The results were 25 successful donations: 22 were of whole blood and 3 were so called “power red” donations.

[Editor’s Note: A Power Red donation is a concentrated dose of red cells, and it allows one to safely donate two units of red blood cells during one donation to help more patients.]

The Red Cross staff overseeing the event said the donated blood donated will be used to helping 55 Phoenix Hospital patients.

This is the second year in a row Shangri-La has sponsored a blood drive. The club found it a great way to reach out to the nearby community; Since nudists’ blood is just a good as anyone else’s. it can give your club some positive publicity.

If you club is not capable of hosting a drive itself, try to find a local blood drive and organize a group of members to donate under your club’s name.

Good News...

Florida

Florida Free Beaches has seen several bills introduced that amend existing Florida law so that “clothing-optional” beach can become legal in the state. **SB 850, SB 1018, and HB 0675** direct state agencies to work with Visit Florida to develop a pilot program where three state owned parks will be “set apart” or designated as clothing optional. In addition, the proviso will direct the Department to modify their rules.

As a backup plan, in case the three bills cited above get stalled or blocked in committee, nudists there are working to get some proviso language inserted in the state’s main budget bill by amendment.

Members of AANR and several other Florida Beach organizations visited the state capitol in January to quietly lobby in favor of clothing-optional beaches, citing the recent Economic Impact study that showed nudist tourism brings in over \$1 billion a year in state tax revenue.

Bills We are Watching...

Very similar bills have been introduced in three different states last month that propose penalties for taking or sharing nude photos. Bills like these often are magnets for unfriendly amendments that often target public nudity. We also have to be careful about penalty creep when a certain offense goes from one felony to a worse felony, for example, just to make the legislator sound stronger on crime. In general, AANR has no problem voyeuristic-type bills as long as the definition does not spill over into nudists taking photos of each other or their own family member. Two of these bills are in our region:

Arizona

HB 2703 - This proposed law allows a civil penalty after an alleged invasion of privacy caused by any unauthorized capture and dissemination of “a live visual image, sound or other physical impression that is captured or taken in this state after December 31, 2020.” Existing Arizona law already addresses civil remedies for theft of property.

For example, a person who uses a drone that invades privacy and takes unauthorized images of a “private, personal or familial activity” such as someone sunbathing nude in a backyard or at a lake could be the target for a civil suit under this proposed new section.

Wyoming

HB 48 - This bill makes it a felony to use any device to take “intimate” photos of another person without their consent. The bill is cosponsored by 10 House and 2 Senators, so it will be hard to justify any opposition to this “voyeur” bill, especially in an election year.

As defined, “intimate area” means any portion of a person’s pubic area, buttocks, vulva, genitals, female breast or undergarments intended to cover those portions. “Intimate area” does not include intimate areas visible through a person’s clothing or intimate areas knowingly exposed in public.

Japanese Smartphone Introduced That Uses AI to Keep Users from Taking Nude Photos

02/20/20 - Japanese company Tone Mobile has released a new smartphone that has a “Smartphone Protection” feature that prevents users from shooting or saving “inappropriate” (i.e. “naked”) photos.

According to the press release issued by the company, the system is powered by what Tone Mobile calls “TONE Security AI,” which is implemented into the phone’s TONE Camera to “prevent self-portrait damage caused by children under the age of 18 being deceived or threatened to photograph their own nudity.” If the AI recognizes that the subject of a photo is “inappropriate,” the camera will lock up; and if you somehow manage to snap a photo before the AI kicks in, the phone won’t let the person save or share it.

Additionally, a feature called “TONE Family” can be set to send an alert to parents whenever an inappropriate image is detected. According to *SoraNews24*, this alert will contain location data and a pixelated thumbnail of the photo in question.

Beyond this special feature, the TONE e20 is like any other budget phone. It has a triple camera system on the back with 13MP, 12MP, and 2MP cameras, a teardrop notch for its front-facing camera, and pretty meager specs overall—exactly what you would expect of a phone that the company hopes to convince parents to buy for their teens.

Social media reactions were mixed, as some critics tweeted this is just the first step down a slippery slope when all of our cameras are programmed to not be able to photograph the police cops, celebrities, or other copyrighted images without an extra \$25 for a license key.

Others point out I may take the tech-savvy youth of Japan about a week to find a way around feature.

The company says it has no plan to bring this phone or this kind of technology to the USA or Europe, but if its sales are good, one never knows.
